Dussehra (also known as Vijayadashami) is the celebration that happens on the tenth day of Navratri. Its observation changes depending on local beliefs and customs, but it generally marks the triumph of good over evil.

Date

It is observed on the tenth day of the month of Ashvin and typically falls in the Gregorian calendar months of September or October.
